Mission of Pavilion Church Internship Program

To engage, equip and empower those seeking to serve in vocational ministries. We serve to fulfill our mission based on biblical principles of servant leadership as exemplified by the distinguishing characteristics of the Pavilion Church, which are based on the four foundational truths found in Jesus' prayer in John 17.

John 17: 1-5: RELATIONSHIP

God in Him, He in us—that we would know Him. Verse 5: "And now, oh Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was."

· John 17:6-10: LEADERSHIP

Jesus gave His leadership to His disciples through relationship. Verse 6: "They were Yours, You gave them to me, and they have kept Your word."

John 17: 11-19: TRUTH

We are sanctified (consecrated, holy) by the truth (God's Word), as He shared it with the disciples. Verse 17: "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth."

· John 17: 20-26: LOVE

The world would believe, through the disciples words and experience of walking with Jesus, the importance of the unity of love. Verses 23-25: "I in them, and You in Me, that they may be made perfect in one, and that the world may know that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have loved Me."



Qualifications

- Must have graduated High School or have GED
- Must be a born again Christian
- Must be a registered voter and actively voting in your state
- Supports the vision and mission of the Pavilion Church
- Have a teachable and humble spirit, ready to work in ministry
- Background Check required

Application Process

- Complete entire application
- Submit a 2 minute video telling us why you would like to intern at Pavilion Church and where you would like to serve. If applying for a worship internship, submit a separate video of you singing or playing an instrument.
- Personal Recommendations This form should be completed by a high school or college teacher or counselor, an employer, pastor, or a friend. This person may not be a relative, and must have known you for at least 3 months.
- Email completed application, video(s), and two completed recommendation forms to Pastor Trinity Wahl at pastortrinity@pavilionchurch.net

Once an application is submitted, prospective interns will receive an email to set up a time for a video conference interview with the head of the intern program, Pastor Trinity Wahl, and a member of our pastoral team.

Intern Expectations & Code of Conduct

Schedule

Our internship program is an eight or twelve month commitment. Internships will be goal and task orientated, not hourly. All Interns will have a role that requires them to be at all Sunday services, Wednesday night services, special events and community outreaches (special exceptions may apply).

Intern Action Plan (IAP)

We believe by following our Intern Action Plan (IAP), every intern at Pavilion Church will be thoroughly equipped and prepared to get the most out of their time at Pavilion. Each intern will have a unique experience and different job descriptions, but is expected to apply the IAP within their specific roles. Interns will be guided through this Action Plan with their Ministry Mentor as well as the head of the Intern Program, Pastor Trinity Wahl.



Pavilion Intern Action Plan:

- Bi-weekly spiritual growth check-in with Ministry Mentor
- Monthly job description check-in with head of Intern Program
- Attend weekly Wednesday Night Bible Study and Sunday Service
- Participation in community outreach projects
- Complete Final Ministry Project
- Read recommended readings
- Participation in Young Adult Ministry (if applicable)
- Fulfillment of ministry roles and responsibilities (job description)

Internship Job Description

Each intern will work with their Ministry Mentor and the head of the Intern Program to develop personalized job descriptions for their time at Pavilion Church. Job descriptions will include all ministry expectations and guidelines, as well as the final ministry project guidelines. This will be a "living document" built throughout the internship with the Ministry Mentor and the head of the Intern Program. All protocols, guidelines and expectations will remain the same, but as each intern works within their ministry, weekly tasks and a final project will develop.

Internship Job Description will include (but is not limited to):

- Ministry Overview
- Role Summary
- Qualifications
- Knowledge & Skills
- Duties & Responsibilities
- Final Project Guidelines and Worksheet

Final Ministry Project

Toward the end of the internship (approximately last month or two) all interns will be asked to complete a community event or "project" led by them as an outreach into the city or into an area of need; this will be a culmination of their time as an intern. Interns will then work with their Ministry Mentor, head of the Intern Program, and Pastoral Team, to take a vision from the Lord and mold it into an outreach event.



Code of Conduct

Relationship

We expect interns to have an active and living relationship with the Lord! We put this first above any tasks or duties of internship. We want to see you grow in Him! Out of that relationship will flow everything else.

Interns are also asked to spend intentional time building relationships with those in the church and community. We want to make sure you feel like a part of the family!

Schedule

As stated above, all interns are expected to attend all Sunday Services, Wednesday Night Bible Study, special events, and community outreaches. We understand that work schedules may conflict, but interns are expected to make these events a schedule priority. (Special exceptions may apply.)

Attitude

Each intern is expected to be ready to learn, listen, and put their hands to work.

Respect

Each intern is expected to show respect to the Ministry Mentors, leaders, pastors, etc. As an intern, these are the people that God has placed in your life to pour into you in this season.

Attire

Interns, as representatives of Pavilion, are asked to dress business casual to services on Sunday - no leggings as pants, short skirts or dresses, crop tops, no short shorts, no torn or holey clothing. Wednesday nights and special events are casual. All interns are expected to wear "church and family" appropriate attire - basically we don't want to *see up it, down it, or through it!*

Social Media

As an intern at Pavilion, you are a representative of the culture here! We ask that interns are prayerfully considering their posts and shares on social media to reflect Biblical values and the heart of Pavilion Church!

Tithing

Leaders are givers! Scripture states that where you are being fed, that is where you should give (1 Cor. 9:7-11, Gal. 6:6, 1 Tim. 5:17-18). As interns, we ask that you tithe to the Pavilion Church. We do not mandate a specific amount, but ask that you give as you purpose in your heart (2 Cor. 9:7).

<u>FAQs</u>

- Is this a paid position?
 - No. Housing accommodations may be available with Pastors or Leaders at Pavilion, but is not guaranteed. We recommend finding funding or a part/full-time job to help cover living costs (car, insurance, phone, food, personal expenses).
- Do interns work on Sundays?
 - Yes, all interns will serve in their designated areas of ministry on Sunday.
- Can I get college credit?
 - If your college or university offers internship opportunities and placements, we will work directly with your advisor and/or professor to ensure you meet all of the necessary requirements.
- Do I need a car?
 - Yes
- Do you provide a computer?
 - We have desktop computers available, but encourage interns to bring their own laptop. Equipment for media teams is or can be otherwise provided. Worship team instruments may be provided this will be discussed in the Intern Interview!
- Am I locked into only serving in the area of my internship?
 - During the time of your internship, our expectation is for you to serve in your area of ministry as outlined by your individualized job description. There is freedom to be creative in your areas of ministry to serve. If you would like to serve in other areas, we encourage you to do so within the guidelines of your Intern Action Plan.
